

Burundi Mining Power Distribution Box



Article Overview

Power distribution for mining in Burundi relies on the national electricity network, with ongoing projects aimed at improving reliability and access for industrial operations, including mining.

Electricity Infrastructure in Burundi

Burundi's electricity sector is vertically integrated, with the Ministry of Water, Energy and Mines, the Autorité de Régulation des secteurs de l'Eau potable et de l'Energie (AREEN), and REGIDESO overseeing production, transmission, and distribution . National electricity access remains low, at 11.6% in 2023, with urban areas better served than rural regions . Installed capacity is 127 MW, with the majority generated from renewable sources such as hydro, solar, and wind . The cost of electricity varies widely, from 3 to 19 USD cents per kWh depending on the year and location .

Mining Sector Power Needs

Mining in Burundi, including gold, tin, tungsten, and tantalum operations, requires reliable medium- and high-voltage electricity for extraction, processing, and refining . Mining permits are regulated under the Mining Code 2023, which mandates local processing within two years of exploitation start . This creates a need for dedicated power distribution infrastructure at mining sites, often involving medium-voltage distribution boxes or substations that step down transmission voltage to levels suitable for mining equipment.
