

Cables cannot be placed in cable trays



Article Overview

Not all cables or utilities can be installed in cable trays; only approved tray-rated electrical cables are permitted, while pipes, tubing, and non-electrical services are prohibited.

Prohibited Installations

Cable trays are designed specifically to support electrical conductors, including power, control, signal, and communication cables. According to NEC Section 300-8, mechanical utility piping or tubing containing water, compressed air, gas, drainage, or steam cannot be installed in cable trays that contain electrical conductors. This ensures safety by preventing potential hazards such as electrical shorts, corrosion, or interference.

Cable Restrictions

Only approved tray-rated cables should be installed in cable trays. These include:

- Tray-rated power cables (Type TC)
 - Metal-clad cables (Type MC)
 - Control and communication cables designed for open-air environments
- Cables that are not rated for open-air or tray use, such as standard non-metallic sheathed cables or single-conductor cables smaller than 1/0 AWG (except under specific industrial conditions), are generally not allowed in cable trays. Using unapproved cables can lead to overheating, fire hazards, or code violations....
