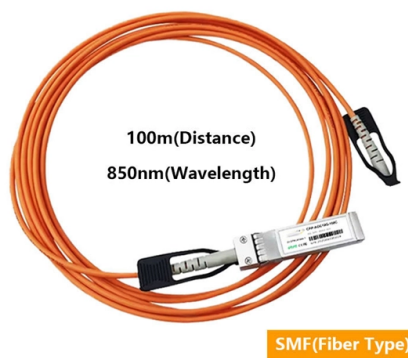


# Can power strips be connected to the electrical distribution box on a construction site

For added safety, use a GFCI-protected power strip or cord to prevent electric shock, especially in damp or outdoor conditions . Portable GFCIs are available in plug-in, cord-connected, or attachment types suitable for construction sites.
4. Correct Wiring and Load Distribution Check that the power strip's total load does not exceed the circuit breaker rating of the distribution box. Avoid daisy-chaining multiple strips, as this c...
