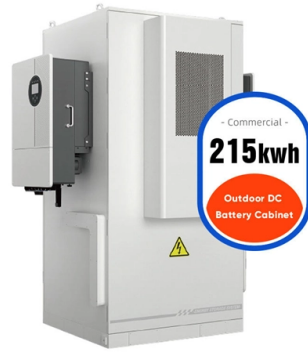


Cold aisle side panel of computer room



Overview

Cold aisle containment systems use doors at aisle ends, ceiling panels or lids above racks, and structural frames to create enclosed zones where cold supply air flows directly to IT equipment intakes. Without containment, cold supply and hot exhaust air mix throughout the data. Cabinets are interconnected through horizontal bridges (not visible in the computer room), and are connected to strong electrical bridges in external corridors; (4) The cabinet adopts a cabinet with a width of 800mm (a standard cabinet of 600mm plus a side cabinet of 200mm) and a depth of 1150mm.
