

Connect the fiber optic cable to the fiber optic transceiver

To connect a fiber optic cable to a transceiver, ensure compatible fiber type and connectors, clean the ends, insert the transceiver properly, and align TX/RX correctly.

Step-by-Step Guide

1. Verify Compatibility Before connecting, confirm that the fiber type (single-mode or multimode) matches the transceiver specifications. Single-mode fibers are used for long-distance, high-bandwidth links, while multimode fibers are suitable for shorter distances. Also, ensure the connector type (commonly LC for SFP modules) matches the transceiver port, and check the supported wavelength and transmission distance to avoid link instability ().
2. Prepare the Transceiver and Cable Insert the SFP or optical transceiver into the compatible switch, router, or media converter until it clicks securely. Remove the protective dust caps from both the transceiver port and the fiber patch cable. Clean the fiber end faces using a lint-free wipe or fiber cleaning tool to reduce insertion loss and prevent signal degradation ().
3. Connect the Fiber Cable Align the LC duplex connectors with the transceiver ports. Insert gently until you hear a click, ensuring a secure connection. Pay attention to TX (transmit) and RX (receive) polarity: the TX on one device must connect to the RX on the opposite device to establish a proper optical link ().
4. Verify the Connection Check the Link LED on the network device to confirm the connection is active. If the LED does not illuminate, recheck the fiber type, connector alignment, and TX/RX orientation. Avoid bending the fiber sharply or applying excessive force, as this can damage the cable or degrade signal quality ().
