

Connection between sub-cable tray and main cable tray



Article Overview

Connecting a sub-cable tray to a main cable tray requires proper alignment, secure support, and compliant jointing to ensure safe and organized cable routing.

Planning and Preparation

Before installation, survey the site and review approved drawings to determine the route of both the main and sub-cable trays, ensuring adequate clearance from walls, equipment, and other structures (). Identify the type of trays (ladder, perforated, or solid-bottom) and the required fittings such as tees, bends, and reducers. Establish an elevation benchmark using a laser level or transit to maintain consistent tray height ().

Support Installation

Install supports for both main and sub-trays using wall-mounted brackets, floor stands, or ceiling hangers. Standard spacing is typically 1.5–3 meters, depending on tray type and load (). Ensure supports are level and aligned before fixing. For threaded rod hangers, pre-thread nuts and verify rod lengths to avoid delays during assembly ().

Tray Assembly and Connection

- Position the main tray on its supports and secure it using coupler plates or tray connectors. Tighten joints to the recommended torque to maintain rigidity ()....
