What is a Core Switch?

A core switch is the primary switch installed at the backbone of a layered or hierarchical network. Engineered to aggregate massive volumes of data from distribution switches, it provides ultra-low latency and maximum throughput to ensure uninterrupted routing and packet. The term campus LAN refers to a LAN network that spans a single geographic location, such as a building or university campus. A campus LAN can be an entire network or part of an enterprise network. An enterprise network is a large network that may contain several campus networks spanning different. It is a powerful backbone switch in the center of the network core layer, which centralizes multiple aggregation switches to the core and implements LAN routing. These networks are designed with three tiers that facilitate strategic installation, management, and maintenance, and so on.
