

Eastern Europe to optical fiber cable



Article Overview

Eastern Europe is experiencing rapid growth in optical fiber deployment, driven by government initiatives, rising demand for high-speed broadband, and strong regional manufacturing hubs.

Market Overview

The Eastern European optical fiber cable market is at a critical digital infrastructure inflection point, with demand projected to grow steadily through 2035. Russia dominates in consumption and production, accounting for 63% of regional demand and 53% of production output, while Poland has emerged as a major export hub, supplying 50% of extra-regional exports and consuming nearly 10,000 tons domestically . The market is characterized by a significant price dichotomy, with export prices averaging \$20,728 per ton versus \$11,086 per ton for imports, reflecting differences in product quality and value capture .

Fiber Rollout and Penetration

Fiber has become the dominant broadband platform across most Eastern European markets. Lithuania, Romania, Latvia, and Russia lead in residential fiber penetration, exceeding 68% of subscribers, while countries like Czechia and Croatia lag below 23% . Government funding, public-private partnerships, and telco investments are key drivers of fiber expansion. For example:

- Lithuania: Telia Lietuva invests heavily in fiber, targeting 100 Mbps speeds for all households by 2027....
