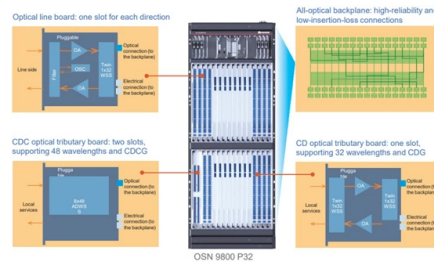


Electrical conduit and cable trays

Cable Trays vs. Conduits

Cable trays are open structural systems designed to support and route multiple cables efficiently. They allow for easy installation, maintenance, and future expansion, as cables can be laid directly into the tray without pulling through enclosed pipes. The open design also provides natural heat dissipation, which helps maintain cable ampacity and prolongs insulation life. Conduits, by contrast, are enclosed pipes that fully protect cables from mechanical damage, moisture, and environmental hazards. They are labor-intensive to install, requiring precise bends and pulling of cables, but they offer superior protection in exposed or high-risk areas.

When Conduits Are Needed with Cable Trays

While cable trays can often be used alone, conduits are recommended or required in certain situations:

- **Exposed or high-impact areas:** Where cables may be struck by machinery, forklifts, or foot traffic, conduits provide necessary mechanical protection.
- **Hazardous environments:** Locations with flammable gases, vapors, or combustible dust require rigid metal conduit to prevent sparks and ensure safety.
- **Underground or wet locations:** Conduits prevent moisture ingress and protect cables in direct burial or washdown areas
