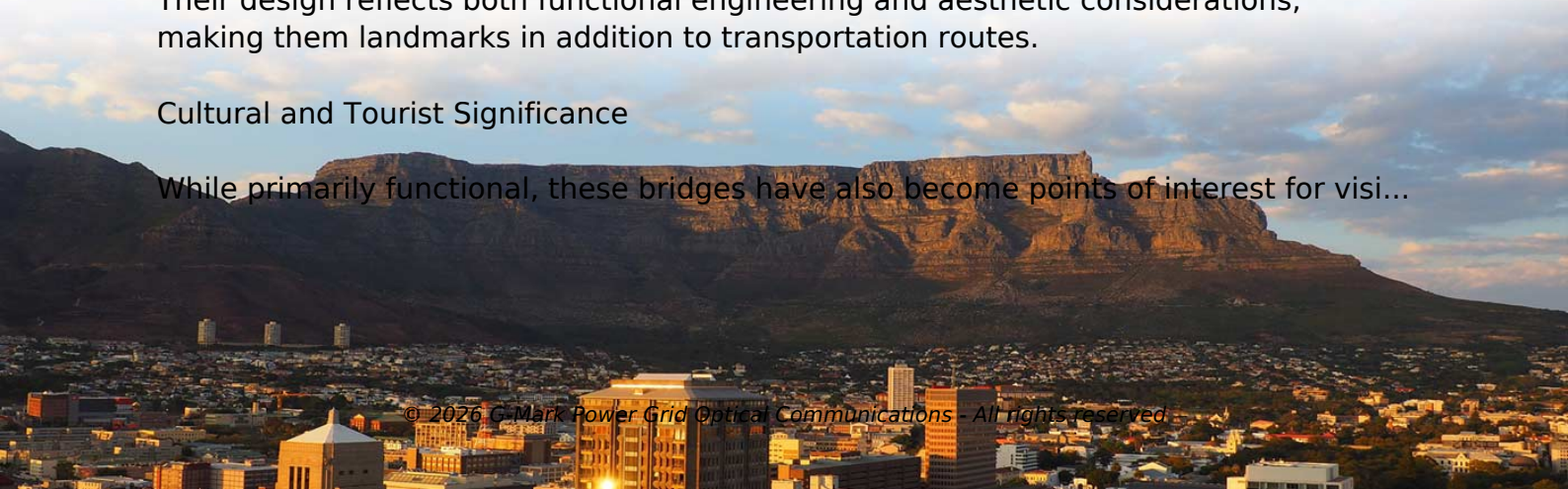

The construction involved advanced techniques for the era, combining steel cables and reinforced concrete to ensure durability and stability . Their design reflects both functional engineering and aesthetic considerations, making them landmarks in addition to transportation routes.
