

Fiber Optic Cable Fixing Scheme



Article Overview

Proper fiber optic cable fixing involves careful handling, correct clamping, maintaining bend radius, and following installation standards to prevent damage and ensure long-term performance.

Key Principles of Fiber Optic Cable Fixing

- 1. Handling and Protection** Fiber optic cables are sensitive to mechanical stress. During installation, protective materials on reels should remain in place until the cable is ready to be fixed in position. Avoid sharp bends, twisting, pinching, or pulling over edges, as these can cause micro-cracks or attenuation issues. LSZH sheathed cables are particularly sensitive to mechanical stress and temperature variations, so care must be taken to prevent damage during installation.
- 2. Bend Radius and Twisting** Maintain the minimum bend radius specified by the manufacturer. Exceeding this radius can permanently damage fibers. When laying loops, use “figure-8” loops to prevent twisting; the loop size typically ranges from 2 to 4 meters depending on cable stiffness.
- 3. Clamping and Support** For vertical or aerial installations, cables should be clamped at frequent intervals to support their weight and prevent sagging. Clamps must not exceed the maximum long-term load of the cable. In horizontal or indoor installations, secure cables to trays, conduits, or walls using appropriate fasteners, ensuring no excessive pressure is applied.
- 4. Environmental Considerations** Ensure the installation area is free from sharp objects, rocks, or other hazards. Outdoor cables exposed for more than 24 hours should be protected from UV, moisture, and mechanical damage. Temperature limits specified in the cable datasheet must be respected during installation and storage.
- 5. Planning and Supervision** Before fixing cables, plan the route, identify splice points, and dete...
