Fiber optic posts are designed for high visibility, often featuring bright colors (orange, yellow, white) and reflective surfaces to be easily seen in low-light conditions or from a distance . Some posts include custom graphics or text to indicate the type of utility, complying with the American Public Works Association (APWA) Uniform Color Code for utility markings
