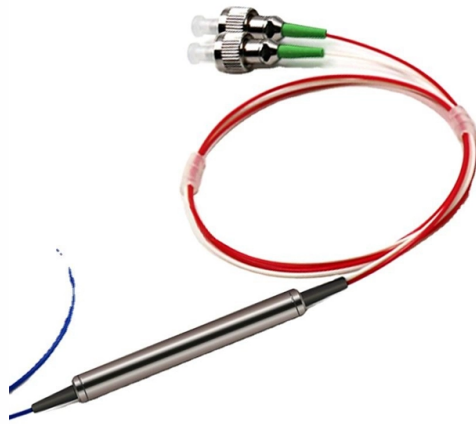


How many meters is a typical fiber optic junction box
