

How many tubes are needed for a 24-core optical cable



Article Overview

A 24-core optical cable can have either a single tube containing all 24 fibers or multiple tubes with fibers distributed among them, depending on the cable design.

Single-Tube Design

Some 24-core optical cables use a single loose tube that contains all 24 fibers. For example, the Enbeam OM4 24-core cable has one dry loose tube holding all 24 color-coded fibers inside a protective jacket, suitable for both internal and external applications. This design simplifies installation and is common in compact, lightweight cables.

Multi-Tube Design

Other 24-core cables use a multi-loose tube configuration, where fibers are divided among several tubes. For instance, certain outdoor 24-core cables have 6 tubes with 4 fibers per tube or 6 tubes with 2 fibers per tube, depending on the manufacturer and fiber type. This approach improves flexibility, mechanical strength, and ease of splicing in large-scale installations.
