

How tall is the secondary distribution box

The standard height for installing a secondary distribution box is typically between 1.4 and 2 meters (4.5 to 6.5 feet) from the floor, depending on accessibility and safety requirements.

Recommended Installation Heights

For wall-mounted secondary distribution boxes, the ideal height is generally 4.5 to 5.5 feet (1.4 to 1.7 meters) above the floor. This ensures that the box is easily accessible for operation and maintenance without excessive bending or stretching, while also protecting it from accidental impacts or water spills . For residential or general use, a height of 1.8 meters (approximately 6 feet) is often recommended to facilitate daily operations . For floor-mounted boxes, the back panel should be at least 0.5 meters above the ground, with additional clearance in damp environments to prevent moisture damage . Outdoor boxes should be installed at least 3 feet above the ground to avoid water and dirt exposure .

Dimensions and Clearances

A typical secondary distribution box may have a height of around 78 inches (approximately 2 meters), with a width of 30 inches and a depth of 36 inches . These dimensions ensure sufficient space for wiring, breakers, and safe working clearances according to standards like NFPA 70E and NEC.
