

How to check multiple circuits in a distribution box

To check circuits in a distribution box, follow safety precautions, identify each circuit, and use a multimeter to test voltage and continuity while inspecting breakers and connections.

Safety First

Before opening a distribution box, turn off the main power and ensure no one can switch it back on while you work. Wear insulated gloves and safety glasses, and make sure your hands are dry. The box should be in a dry, accessible location with good airflow .

Identify Components

A typical distribution box contains:

- Main MCB (Double Pole): Controls the incoming power supply.
- Output MCBs (Single or Double Pole): Protect individual circuits.
- RCCB: Provides protection against leakage current and electrical shock.
- Bus Bars and Neutral Links: Distribute power to each circuit . Check the labels on each breaker to understand which load or area it controls. If labels are missing or unclear, note them down during inspection .
