

How to connect a pigtail to an optical fiber

The most reliable way to connect a fiber optic pigtail to an optical fiber is by splicing—either fusion splicing for a permanent low-loss connection or mechanical splicing for a temporary or semi-permanent joint.

Understanding Fiber Pigtails

A fiber optic pigtail is a short optical fiber with a factory-installed connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other. The connector end plugs into equipment, while the bare end is designed to be spliced to the incoming fiber cable, ensuring a precise, low-loss connection .

Tools and Materials Needed

- Fusion splicer (for permanent splicing) or mechanical splice holder (for temporary connections)
- Fiber cleaver to cut the fiber cleanly
- Fiber stripper to remove the protective coating
- Isopropyl alcohol and lint-free wipes for cleaning
- Protective splice sleeves or trays to secure the joint

Step-by-Step Fusion Splicing

- Prepare the fibers: Strip the protective coating from both the pigtail and the incoming fiber, leaving the bare glass exposed. Clean the fibers with isopropyl alco...
