

How to connect the two connectors of a fiber optic patch cord

Proper cleaning prevents signal loss and ensures a reliable connection . 3. Inspect the Fiber Ends Examine the fiber ends for cracks, chips, or dirt using a fiber inspection microscope. Damaged fibers can degrade performance or break during connection . 4. Align and Insert the Connectors

- For patch cords with matching connectors, insert each connector into a compatible fiber optic adapter or port.
- Ensure the ferrules are properly aligned; the fiber cores must meet precisely to allow uninterrupted light transmission .
- Push the connector until it clicks or locks in place, depending on the connector type .
