

How to fix fiber optic cables

- Fusion splicer: for permanent, low-loss connections .
- Mechanical splice or inline connector: for temporary or quick repairs .
- Alcohol wipes and cleaning tools: to remove dust and contaminants .

Step 3: Prepare the Fiber Ends

Trim any frayed or damaged sections of the cable. Strip the outer coating to expose...
