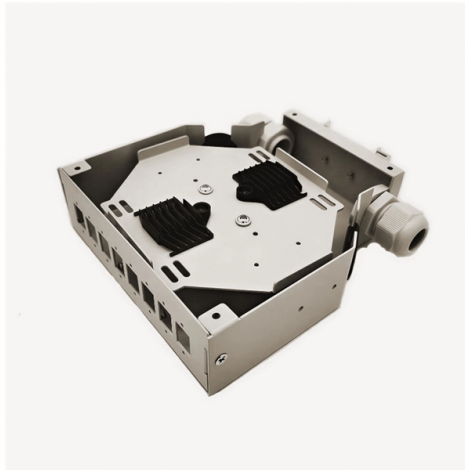

- **Routing and Bundling:** Route wires along the edges or corners of the box and bundle them using cable ties, Velcro straps, or wire ducts. Avoid crossing wires unnecessarily .
- **Grounding First:** Connect and secure all ground wires first, tucking them neatly into corners to keep them out of the way
