

How to open a national standard optical cable



Article Overview

The standard method for opening optical fiber cables involves careful removal of protective layers, maintaining bend radius, minimizing mechanical stress, and following safety and installation guidelines to prevent fiber damage.

General Principles

Opening and handling optical fiber cables must follow national and industry standards such as FOA and NECA guidelines to ensure safety and cable integrity . Key principles include:

- **Safety First:** Always wear eye protection and handle fiber scraps carefully to avoid injury .
- **Clean Environment:** Ensure the work area is free of sharp objects or debris that could damage the cable sheath .
- **Temperature Considerations:** Avoid exposing cables to extreme temperatures during opening, as LSZH and other sheaths are sensitive to cracking under mechanical stress .

Cable Opening Steps

- **Remove Outer Protective Layers:**
- Carefully strip the outer jacket using appropriate tools without nicking the inner fibers .
- For armored cables, remove armor carefully to avoid crushing the fibers
