

How to route cables for a mobile fiber optic router

For a mobile fiber optic router, route cables carefully by connecting the fiber to the ONT, using Ethernet to the router, and securing all cables to prevent bends, damage, or disconnections.

Step 1: Connect the Fiber to the ONT

Fiber optic cables cannot plug directly into a standard router; they must first connect to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts optical signals into electrical signals for your router (). When routing the fiber:

- Handle with care: Hold the connector by its plastic housing and avoid touching the glass tip.
- Remove dust caps: Only remove protective caps immediately before connecting.
- Maintain minimum bend radius: Avoid sharp bends to prevent signal loss or fiber breakage.
- Secure the cable: Use cable clips or Velcro straps to prevent movement during transport.

Step 2: Connect the ONT to the Router

Once the fiber is connected to the ONT:

- Use a Cat 6 or Cat 6a Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN port to the router's...
