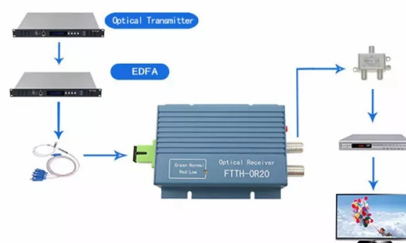


Identification of optical cables passing through the equipment room on the ODF rack



Overview

Labels should be placed 3-6 inches away from each endpoint and the text is oriented to read naturally facing the rack of equipment. For cable runs that are longer than 50 feet, label them at midpoints, as well as any access panels. Unlabeled cables aren't just messy; they're costly. They slow troubleshooting, complicate upgrades, and introduce unnecessary downtime. Effective cable label management is essential for data-center operations, as it enables precise tracking of cable routes, functions, and associated hardware. Cable labeling standards are. Labels should be pervasive; cables and connecting hardware should be labeled, but so should conduits and firestops, grounding and bonding locations, racks, cabinets, ports, and telecommunications spaces.
