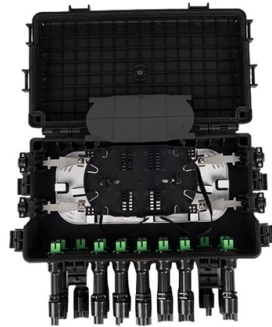


Is the network connected by the router a fiber optic network

A router itself is not directly a fiber optic device; it connects to a fiber optic network through an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts light signals from the fiber into data your router can use.

How Fiber Networks Connect to Routers

Fiber optic internet transmits data as pulses of light through ultra-thin glass or plastic cables, offering high speeds, low latency, and minimal signal loss. In a typical home or office setup, the fiber line terminates at an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts the light signals into electrical signals that can be transmitted via Ethernet to your router. The router then distributes this data to your devices over Wi-Fi or wired connections.

Identifying a Fiber Connection

Even if your router is labeled as a "fiber router," it does not mean the router itself is fiber; it is designed to handle the high speeds and bandwidth of a fiber connection. Key indicators that your network is fiber include:

- Presence of an ONT device installed by your ISP.
- Ethernet connection from the ONT to your router.
- High-speed internet plan advertised as Fiber-to-the-Home (FTTH) or fiber broadband....
