An OLT is the central control device in a Passive Optical Network (PON) that connects the service provider to multiple ONTs, which are the endpoint devices at subscriber premises.

Optical Line Terminal (OLT)

An Optical Line Terminal (OLT), also called an optical line termination, is a network device located at the service provider's central office, data center, or ISP Point of Presence (PoP), . Its primary functions include:

- **Signal Conversion:** Converts electrical signals from the provider's backbone into optical signals for transmission over fiber .
- **Data Distribution:** Manages downstream and upstream traffic to multiple ONTs or Optical Network Units (ONUs) connected via a Passive Optical Network (PON), .
- **Bandwidth Management:** Allocates bandwidth dynamically to ensure efficient network performance and quality of service .
- **Security and Fault Management:** Implements security measures and monitors network health to detect and handle faults . OLT devices can support various PON standards such as GPON, EPON, XGS-PON, and 10G-EPON, and may have multiple ports, each capable of connecting dozens of ONTs depending on the split ratio (e.g., 1:32, 1:64, or up to 1:128 for XGS-PON), . OLTs come in different form factors, including box-type for small-scale deployments and rack-mounted for large-scale networks, offering modularity, redundancy, and high scalability
