Installing cross-wiring in a distribution box typically costs between \$300 and \$1,200, depending on complexity, panel type, and labor rates.

Factors Affecting Cost

- **Panel Type and Size:** Residential distribution boards generally cost less to wire than commercial or industrial panels due to fewer circuits and simpler layouts . Modern boards with RCDs or smart monitoring features may increase costs .

- **Installation Complexity:** Cross-wiring involves connecting multiple circuits within the distribution box, ensuring proper line-to-line, neutral-to-neutral, and ground connections, and labeling each circuit for maintenance . Additional work may be required if the existing panel is outdated, full, or has faults .
- **Permits and Compliance:** Local electrical codes may require permits, inspections, or certification, which can add 5-15% to the total cost depending on the region .
