

Requirements for the ground clearance of primary distribution boxes



Article Overview

Primary distribution boxes should have a minimum front clearance of 3 feet, side clearance of 30 inches, and a headroom of at least 6.5 feet to ensure safe operation and maintenance.

Minimum Clearances

Front Clearance: A minimum of 3 feet (36 inches) in front of the distribution box is required to allow personnel to operate equipment safely, open doors fully, and perform maintenance without obstruction. This clearance ensures that electricians can move tools and equipment safely and provides space to fall or jump away in case of an electrical incident (). **Side Clearance:** The sides of the enclosure should have at least 30 inches of clearance, or the width of the equipment itself if greater. This side-to-side working space allows safe lateral movement and access to panels or components (). **Vertical Clearance / Headroom:** The minimum headroom in front of the equipment should be 6.5 feet (≈ 2 meters) or the height of the equipment, whichever is greater. This ensures that personnel can work comfortably and safely without crouching or being forced into awkward positions ().

Additional Considerations

- **Dedicated Work Space:** The area around the primary distribution box must be clear of obstructions such as pipes, cabinets, or other equipment. The dedicated space extends from the floor to at least 6 feet above the equipment or to the structural ce...
