

Spacing of Cable Tray Channel Steel Supports



Article Overview

Cable tray channel steel supports should generally be spaced 3 to 5 meters for horizontal runs and 1.5 meters for vertical runs, with proper tie spacing and clearance to ensure safety, structural integrity, and heat dissipation.

Horizontal Support Spacing

For horizontal cable tray runs, channel steel supports should be installed at intervals of 3 to 5 meters along the tray length, depending on the tray type, load, and cable weight. Supports must be placed at the start, end, and at every turn to maintain stability and prevent sagging. Proper alignment ensures that cables remain straight, organized, and free from mechanical stress, which is critical for both power and control cables .

Vertical Support Spacing

For vertical cable tray runs, supports should be installed at every 1.5 meters. This spacing prevents excessive bending or stress on the cables and maintains the tray's structural integrity. Vertical supports are particularly important in long risers or when trays pass through multiple floors .

Cable Binding and Tie Spacing

Cables within the tray should be tied at intervals not exceeding 1.5 meters, ensurin...
