Overview

Three-phase elevator box is installed in the latest step of the process in the elevator machine room. A few years later, in 1880, Werner von Siemens built the first electric elevator, setting the stage for a new industry that would change the world by making the practical use of tall buildings. The distribution box (DB box) helps safely and efficiently distribute electrical power. But what exactly is a power distribution box, and why is it so essential in our daily lives?

The DB panel board controls the flow of electricity. The elevator power box is responsible for supplying and controlling. NEC Article 620 governs electrical installation and wiring for elevators, dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, platform lifts and stairway chairlifts, aligning with ASME A17. It defines hoistway, machine-room, remote machine-room and control-space terms, limits most supply voltages to 300 V. Eaton's Elevator Control panelboards provide electric power distribution with integrated fusible switches, metering, and surge protection. The elevator will be out of service if electric power is not supplied.
