Protective Insulation

Like standard heat shrink tubing, pigtail heat shrink tubing is made from materials such as polyolefin, PVC, or fluoropolymers that shrink tightly around wires or components when heated, providing electrical insulation, mechanical protection, and environmental sealing against moisture, dust, and abrasion . The tubing can also include adhesive liners to enhance sealing and adhesion to the underlying wire or component.

Stress and Vibration Absorption

The pigtail design, which forms a coiled or looped section, allows the tubing to flex under mechanical stress, vibration, or thermal expansion without transmitting these forces directly to the connected components. This reduces the risk of wire fatigue, connector damage, or failure in sensitive electrical or instrumentation systems .
