

Two-wire connection of fiber optic patch cord



Article Overview

Fiber optic patch cords should be connected via adapters or patch panels, ensuring transmitters connect to receivers and proper polarity is maintained.

Proper Connection Method

To connect two fiber optic cables using a patch cord, follow this standard approach: Cable A → Adapter Panel → Patch Cord → Adapter Panel → Cable B. The patch cord acts as a flexible link between the two cables, allowing easy maintenance and reconfiguration without permanent splicing. Avoid fusion splicing inside cabinets or patch panels, as it is permanent, space-limited, and more prone to signal loss.

Steps to Connect

- **Inspect and Clean Connectors:** Use lint-free wipes or fiber cleaning pens to remove dust and oils from the connector ferrules. Never touch the fiber tip with bare hands.
- **Identify Connector Types:** Ensure compatibility between connectors (e.g., SC, LC, ST) and avoid mismatched types like APC to UPC, which can cause reflection and signal loss.
- **Insert into Adapter Panel:** Securely mount the adapters in the patch panel. Insert the patch cord connectors into the adapters until they click firmly.
- **Maintain Polarity:** For duplex links, ensure that transmitters (TX) connect to receivers (RX) and vice versa. Typically, odd-numbered fibers go to transmitters and even-numbered fibers to receivers. If the permanent cable plant is crossed, use straight-through patch cords; otherwise, a crossed patch cord may be needed
