Human and Construction-Related Causes

The most common cause of fiber optic cable cuts is human activity, particularly during construction or excavation. Buried cables can be severed by heavy machinery used for roadworks, trenching, or drilling, especially if the cable location is not properly marked or ignored by crews, a phenomenon often referred to as “Digger's Law” . Mistakes during installation, maintenance, or repair work can also result in accidental cuts .

Environmental and Natural Causes

Fiber optic cables are vulnerable to natural disasters and severe weather. Flooding, ice storms, strong winds, earthquakes, and landslides can physically damage or break both underground and aerial cables . Even minor ground shifts or bending can cause signal attenuation or complete failure due to the delicate glass or plastic cores of the fibers .
