- **Bend-Insensitive Fiber:** Uses G.657.A2 fibers that tolerate tight bends without significant signal loss, crucial for indoor corners and conduit installations.
- **Reinforcement and Protection:** Indoor cables often use FRP (Fiber Reinforced Plastic) for non-conductive strength, while outdoor cables may include steel wire, water-blocking layers, and UV-resistant sheaths to withstand environmental stress.
- **Ease of Installation:** Designed for flexibility, lightweight handling, and compatibility with field connectors, simplifying splicing and maintenance.
