

What is a spectrometer that holds a solution called



Overview

A spectrophotometer consists of several core components: a light source (e., a tungsten or xenon lamp), a collimator to create a straight beam of light, a monochromator (like a prism or diffraction grating) to select a specific wavelength, the cuvette holding the sample. A spectrometer (/ spɛk'trɒmɪtər /) is a scientific instrument used to separate and measure spectral components of a physical phenomenon. Cuvettes are designed to hold. In the lexicon of the modern laboratory, the term “cuvette” (Here View HINOTEK Cuvette) is often defined simply as a small, rectangular vessel used to hold liquid samples for analysis. But what is a cuvette, and why is it so important in science today?

A cuvette is a special transparent container for spectroscopic tests. These small, precise vessels help researchers analyze liquid samples with high accuracy.
