

What is strictly prohibited when there is a fiber optic cable underneath



Article Overview

Excavating, applying excessive tension, bending beyond limits, or exposing fiber ends to laser light are strictly prohibited when a fiber optic cable is buried underground.

Excavation and Digging Restrictions

Digging or trenching directly above or near a buried fiber optic cable without proper location verification is strictly prohibited. Underground fiber cables are typically buried 18–48 inches deep depending on local regulations and site conditions, and accidental digging can sever the cable, causing service outages and costly repairs . Always use utility location services and follow local municipal codes before any excavation.

Mechanical Stress and Cable Handling

Fiber optic cables are sensitive to mechanical stress. It is prohibited to:

- Exceed the maximum tensile strength of the cable during pulling or installation, as this can damage the fibers and reduce service life .
- Bend the cable below its minimum bending radius, which can cause signal loss or fiber breakage .
- Apply sudden jerks or frequent starts and stops when pulling the cable through conduits
