

What is the yellow wire on the fiber optic cable connector called



Overview

Single-mode fiber (OS1 and OS2) always comes in a yellow jacket. OS1 is used for indoor, tight-buffered cabling, while OS2 is used outdoors or in loose-tube designs. Perhaps nothing is more complex in fiber optics than maintaining polarity of fibers when using multi-fiber array. The most common standard for fiber optic color coding is the EIA/TIA-598-C standard, which identifies jacket colors (the outer jacket around each single-mode or multi-mode fiber), internal fiber color (the colors of the individual internal fibers), and connector color codes (colors assigned to). Cable jacket colors represent the most immediate visual identifier in fiber optic systems, allowing instant recognition of fiber types and performance capabilities.
