A fiber optic panel (or termination box/ODF) is a centralized or endpoint enclosure for terminating and managing fiber cables, while a fiber patch panel is a rack-mounted or wall-mounted hub for connecting and rerouting pre-terminated fibers.

Core Functions

Fiber Optic Panel (Termination Box/ODF):

- Serves as the final termination point for fiber cables at or near the end-user location or in a central network room .
- Provides protection, organization, and splicing for incoming fiber cables.
- Typically used in core rooms, data centers, or FTTH deployments where large-capacity cables from carriers or backbone networks are terminated .
- Can be wall-mounted or rack-mounted, with integrated splice trays and cable management features .

Fiber Patch Panel:

- Acts as a distribution hub for pre-terminated fiber cables, allowing technicians to connect, disconnect, or reroute fibers without splicing .
- Primarily rack-mounted or wall-mounted in server rooms, floor wiring closets, or data centers.
- Provides high-density port access for switches, servers, and other network devices.
- Supports frequent network changes and easy management of jumper connections .
