Types of Network Security Equipment

Common network security devices include firewalls, intrusion prevention systems (IPS), unified threat management (UTM) systems, network access control (NAC), email security gateways, web application firewalls (WAF), and VPN gateways. Each device serves a specific role in monitoring traffic, detecting threats, and securing access to the network ().

Methods to Verify Installation

- **Physical Inspection:** Check that devices are physically present, properly mounted, and connected to power and network cables. Look for any signs of damage or loose connections ().
- **Configuration and Status Checks:** Access the device management interface to confirm it is powered on, configured correctly, and actively monitoring traffic. Firewalls, for example, should have rules applied and deny unauthorized traffic by default ().
- **Network Security Audit:** Conduct a network security audit to systematically evaluate the infrastructure. This includes reviewing documentation, assessing risks, performing vulnerability tests, and verifying compliance with security standards ()....
